Saturday's stableford saw some excellent scores across all grades with 35 pts needed to win a ball highlighting the standard of play for the day. The 2017 Club Champion, Joshua Tracey, showed his class in winning the A Grade Competition with an outstanding 41 pts from his 2 handicap, equating to a 3 under par score. He had 6 birdies and was 5 under with two holes to go—his playing partners said he did it very easily, knocking in putts all day. Joshua has plenty of talent and would be competitive in any company. Daniel Turner, last year's B Grade champion, was runner up with his excellent 39 pts after being only 1 over par after 14 holes. Steve Ross enjoyed his last game of golf before returning to work (as a school teacher) this week, winning B Grade with a well compiled 40 pts, the same score he had in Friday's Australia Day event. Steve played consistent golf all day with his new utility club short game working beautifully. Richard Crooks was runner up with the same score, showing he is ready for the Seniors Vets opening game next week (as my partner!). Steve Primmer's 43 pts easily won C Grade, an excellent score on any day, with Lee Jackson's 41 pts good enough for runner up. The shot of the day belonged to Col Hughes on the last, finishing only 110cms away although Wayne Oliver's shot to the difficult 13<sup>th</sup>, only 145cms away deserves special mention. This was the third round of the Summer Cup where the best 4 of 5 rounds are counted. An average of 40 pts is going to be needed to win this competition, with a number of players already lining up for the prize.
